


## **Background Information**

Cairo is the greatest city of Egypt. But the extremely precious historic core, from which today's huge metropolis grew, is in great danger.



## Historic Cairo is now spreading over more than 450sq km

- Occupied by some 16 million people
- Severe housing shortages
- Unemployment rate of 20 %
- •Many of the historic district are ruinous and given over to virtual slums.
- Poverty, unemployment and illiteracy
- Lack of awareness of the value of historic buildings.

Yet historic Cairo has a distinctive architectural identity and contains the largest concentration of Islamic monuments in the world, both in quality and in quantity. The historic components are included in Unesco's Heritage List, but Historic Cairo is not considered as a World Heritage Site, or any of its components.

## **Category A**


High density of valuable & monuments, & distinct urban tissue

## **Category B**

Medium intensity gives the sense of history and the fabric is original or mixed Buffer zone for area A

## **Category C**

Buffer zone for both areas A & B Includes some individual monuments Important Visual axis, Preface to historic area




